Eaton Village Residents' Association – Friends of Donkey Lane

Eaton Village Residents' Association – The aim of the Association is to protect and promote the interests of Eaton Village Residents and to protect and enhance the amenities of Eaton Village. This includes liaising with Norwich City Council and local Councillors on matters and issues of interest to residents and the organisation of activities and events for residents such as: Annual Scarecrow Festival, Garage Sales, Quizzes, and other activities. The Friends of Donkey Lane group was formed in 2015 to maintain and manage the banks and verges of Donkey Lane which is an ancient track linking Church Lane to Newmarket Road via Greenways and Sunningdale. Initially our volunteers

cleared nettles and bramble from the area and planted around 800 hedging trees and 500 bulbs to soften the effects of a metal fence installed to protect the Eaton Chalk Quarry - a SSSI. A further 125 hedging trees were planted in 2024. The volunteers meet periodically at weekends to keep the footpath tidy and manage the planting on the banks. The aim is to maintain an attractive, manageable, environmentally friendly area, which forms part of a green link between the Chalk Quarry and Marston Marsh. Our work is much appreciated by the many Eaton residents who use the footpath.
