Get InVOLed was recently launched by Voluntary Norfolk. You can reach the website by **clicking the link above**. The Get InVOLved Norfolk Platform is looked after by the Communities Team at Voluntary Norfolk. As well as supporting individuals into volunteering they give advice to groups, encouraging them to join the support network. Alongside this, Get InVOLed run a Momentum service specifically for organisations working with young people. They also help volunteers to find a volunteering role and organisations to recruit the volunteers they are looking for. This includes:

- Helping organisations promote their volunteer opportunities and giving advice on how best to recruit through the Get InVOLved Volunteering Platform
- Linking volunteer-involving organisations through their Volunteer Co-ordinator network.
- Producing a monthly newsletter for volunteers, 'Volunteering News'.
- Offering additional support to people looking for volunteering roles.
- Promoting volunteering across the County and support people to use the website to find the volunteering role that suits them.
- Supporting organisation with their volunteer management.
- Managing the Volunteer Passport scheme; a program of training and support for volunteers, which aims to help people gain more confidence and move more easily between roles, if they want to.


right). You will receive an automated email asking you to confirm your email address. As soon as you verify your email, you're free to use LUMi!

- Volunteering.


